Aleksandra Gavrilovska-Brzanov, MD, MSc, PhD, is a board-certified anesthesiologist and intensive care specialist with a subspecialty in pediatric anesthesia. She completed her medical education, residency training, master’s degree, and doctoral studies at the “Ss Cyril and Methodius” University in Skopje. She currently serves as an Ass. Professor of Anesthesiology and Intensive Care at the Medical Faculty in Skopje, where she is actively involved in academic education, mentorship, and clinical training. In 2024, she was appointed Deputy National Transplant Coordinator of the Republic of North Macedonia. In 2025, she was selected as a national expert for the Council of Europe’s working group on the “Guide on Safety and Quality in Transplantation,” under the auspices of the EDQM. Dr. Gavrilovska-Brzanov is the founder and vice president of the NGO “Young Doctors Club,” a platform that promotes professional growth, advocacy, and educational empowerment among early-career medical professionals. She has participated in numerous international seminars and high-profile training programs, including the Teach the Teachers Masterclass by ESAIC. Her international experience includes medical missions in Sudan (Khartoum) under the Italian NGO “Emergency,” Kuwait City, and with the International Children’s Heart Foundation in the field of cardiac anesthesia. She has also completed clinical observation and education in New York (USA), France, Germany, Slovenia, Greece, Denmark, and Austria. Dr. Gavrilovska-Brzanov has been an invited speaker at international educational events, including advanced workshops, medical seminars, and congresses in Croatia, Turkey, Albania, Serbia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Austria, Greece and Kosovo. In addition to her clinical and teaching roles, she is a dedicated researcher involved in multiple international multicentric clinical trials and collaborative studies focusing on anesthesia, critical care, transplantation, and patient safety—contributing to the advancement of evidence-based practice in low- and middle-income countries.
