

Dr **Victoria Metaxa** is a full-time Critical Care and Major Trauma Consultant, at King's College Hospital in London. She is a King's College London Honorary Clinical Senior Lecturer; has a PhD in neurosciences and an MA in Medical Ethics and Palliative Care from Keele University. She is a practicing intensivist and her clinical interests include bioethics, end-of-life care, critical care outreach and the management of patients with haematological malignancies. She is the clinical lead of the Critical Care Outreach Team of King's College Hospital, as well as the end-of-life ICU lead.

Dr Metaxa is the Chair of the European Society of Intensive Care (ESICM) Ethics section. She is the UK National Outreach Forum Board Secretary and the Chair of the Legal and Ethical Advisory Group (LEAG) of the UK Intensive Care Society (ICS). Victoria is a frequent invited speaker at national and international meetings

Victoria has set up and leading on the haemato-oncology/ critical care provision at King's College Hospital. She is heavily involved in the provision of Chimeric Antigen Receptor (CAR) -T therapy, aiming to accelerate clinical experience, promote research and define a working framework in the emerging field of immune cell therapy. She is the clinical lead for Critical Care Outreach Team of the Trust, as well as the end-of-life ICU lead.

Dr Niall Ferguson is Professor in the Interdepartmental Division of Critical Care Medicine, Department of Medicine, at the University of Toronto, with cross-appointments in the Department Physiology and the Institute of Health Policy, Management and Evaluation. He is a practicing Intensivist and Clinician-Scientist at the University Health Network and is the Medical Director of the Toronto General Hospital Medical-Surgical ICU. He is a Senior Scientist in the Toronto General Research Institute and Director of the Toronto General Hospital Clinical Research Unit. At a provincial level, Dr Ferguson is Deputy chair of the Ontario Critical Care Command Centre. Dr Ferguson's research, which is supported by national and provincial peer-reviewed grants, investigates treatments for patients with acute hypoxemic respiratory failure with a focus on clinical trials in mechanical ventilation and extra-corporeal life support. He has published more than 300 papers listed on PubMed and his H-index is over 80. Dr Ferguson is the Chair for Critical Care Canada Forum, Canada's national critical care conference. He is a frequent invited speaker at national and international meetings, having given over 400 such talks.
